

Eva Lundsager Ovation

May 5 - June 11, 2023

(March 30, 2023 – Brookline, MA) Praise Shadows is honored to present *Ovation* by Eva Lundsager, the artist's first solo exhibition in Boston. A painter who has exhibited internationally since her first show at the legendary Gracie Mansion Gallery in 1989, this body of work focuses on ten medium to large size oil on canvas paintings that celebrate atmosphere over representation, and the act of painting over the process of analyzing. The generously sized works are visual cues for the viewer to simply exist in front of a work of art. The artist encourages disassociating from categorizations and labels. Above all, *Ovation* is a celebration of experiencing art for art's sake.

"There is something compelling and challenging about working within the confines of a tradition," says Lundsager. "No special materials, no attempts to redefine the rules of painting, and instead just working to address the complexity of life on our planet as it is now, through the basic tools of paint and canvas."

The joy in the practice of expressive painting is evident throughout the works selected for this exhibition. Orbs levitate and appear to glow, shapes explode and collapse into themselves, whorls seem to coalesce and dissipate all at once. There is a sense of erosion, or excavation. These gestures and sensibilities are

exemplified in the large painting, *First Attempt* (2019, oil on canvas, 60x84 inches), an image that borders on the edge of recognition. Lundsager's characteristic upward paint-drips connect a fiery red mesh-like formation with a sky-blue and gray expanse above. Clarity is not the objective. Instead, her paintings encourage the viewer to let go of such goals, and to acknowledge that the act of engagement is enough.

In the sublime *We Are Quiet* (2021, oil on canvas, 24 x 24 inches), the painting inhabits a cool blue-white atmosphere. Joyful wisps of the brush dance exuberantly between blue and white. Lundsager punctuates that energy with jolts of red that appear to ooze dangerously close to the cool-toned revelry. There is no specific narrative that the artist is attempting to articulate. Rather, the painting, as in all of her work, should be thought of as a moment in time, one that has a before and an after. Leaning into the tenuousness of such moments, Lundsager reminds us to celebrate them all.

About the artist

Eva Lundsager has been exhibiting her art for more than three decades, including multiple solo shows in New York at the Greenberg Van Doren, Van Doren Waxter, and Jack Tilton galleries. Her work is in the permanent collections of the Dallas Museum of Art, the Nerman Museum of Contemporary Art, the St. Louis Art Museum, and the Whanki Foundation in Seoul, and it has been covered in Art in America, Artforum, Bomb, the Brooklyn Rail, the New York Times, the New Yorker, and Time Out New York. She attended the University of Maryland and received her MFA from Hunter College. After living in New York for sixteen years, she spent a decade in Saint Louis, MO, where she often watched the quickly changing weather and dramatic skies. In 2012 she moved with her family to Boston, where she maintains a studio in Framingham, and teaches painting at the School of the Museum of Fine Arts at Tufts University. Recent exhibitions include the 2019 deCordova Museum Biennial in Lincoln, MA; and American Genre: Contemporary Painting, curated by Michelle Grabner, at the Institute of Contemporary Art in Portland, ME. She is a Guggenehim Fellow in painting.
